Contenido: Predictions and possibilities

"Will" for making predictions

What is a prediction? It is a statement of what you think will happen in the future.

The future simple (**Will**) is used to make predictions that are based on personal judgement, opinion or intuition, and not on present evidence. Whether or not the event will happen is not certain. Such predictions are often introduced by I think / I don't think.

For example:

- I think the weather **will** be nice this afternoon.
- I don't think he **will** come tonight.
- I predict that Congress **will** pass an anti-piracy law soon.
- If you ask him, he **will** probably give you a lift.

"Might" to express possibility

What is a possibility? It is a chance that something may happen or be true.

The modal verb **"might"** is used to express specific possibilities in the present or in the future, that is to say, perhaps something is going to happen.

For example:

- He's very good, in fact, I think he **might** win the competition.
- She **might** be late because of the public transport strike.

Form: Pronoun + **might** + verb + complement (it might rain today)
